Subject: UPDATE REGARDING THE ROSSMOOR COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT REQUEST TO ORANGE COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS FOR TRAFFIC SAFETY UPGRADES THROUGHOUT THE COMMUNITY

RECOMMENDATION

Review and discuss information provided.

BACKGROUND

The Rossmoor Community Services District (RCSD) Board of Directors and the Traffic Safety Advisory Ad Hoc Committee have reviewed traffic safety information and recommendations from Orange County Public Works (OCPW). Because a holistic approach is desired to provide the best outcome for the Rossmoor community, this review process is ongoing and will include representatives from the Rossmoor Homeowners Association (RHA), Los Alamitos Unified School District (LAUSD), Orange County Sheriff's, California Highway Patrol, and community members.

INFORMATION

At the December 8, 2020 Rossmoor Community Services District (RCSD) Board of Directors meeting, the Board gave staff direction to communicate with the Orange County Public Works (OCPW) to begin the process of instituting the following traffic safety measures:

1. Replace current 30-inch stop signs at Bradbury Road, Copa De Oro Drive, and Mainway Drive on both sides of Montecito Road, with 36-inch stop signs for better visibility.
2. Provide a strip of retroreflective material on the supports of the stop signs identified above; material to be at least 2-inches in width, placed for the full length of the support from the sign to within 2-feet above the edge of the roadway, and its color shall match the background color of the sign, to further enhance visibility.

3. Work with the California Highway Patrol (CHP) and OCPW to schedule their respective portable Radar Speed Feedback Sign (RSFS) trailers throughout the community during 2021 (see Attachment 1).

Staff has made contact with OCPW to request these items and OCPW is in the process of implementing them.

In addition, staff is working on the following items as directed by the RCSD Board at their December 8, 2020 meeting:

1. Work with the residents on Tigertail Drive to identify possible locations for consideration of permanent RSFS's. Residents along Tigertail Drive are conducting a survey regarding the feasibility of adding permanent RSFS's.
2. Research OCPW's alternative solution to slowing speeds on Montecito Road, Tigertail Drive, and possibly other streets by restriping to identify parking lanes and changing the width of driving lanes in order to slow down traffic. The General Manager asked OCPW for sample locations to view that utilize the lane configuration that OCPW is suggesting. Subsequently, the General Manager toured an unincorporated area of Tustin and took photos (Attachment 2). After visiting the site, the General Manager determined that Hedwig Road and Foster Road are similar to the Tustin example (Attachment 3). Thus, this concept is already being used in Rossmoor. In order to move forward, it is suggested that the Traffic Safety Advisory Ad Hoc Committee discuss this item and make recommendations.
3. Contact and include the Los Alamitos Unified School District (LAUSD) as a participant on the Traffic Safety Advisory Ad Hoc Committee. As a result, Dr. Jerry Friedman, Director of Safety and Student Services has been assigned to represent the LAUSD on this Committee.
4. Staff has requested that OCPW provide a Geographic Information System (GIS) map that will show locations of signs and street markings within Rossmoor. Staff is working with OCPW to secure this data in order to evaluate the consistency of the existing signage and road markings throughout Rossmoor.

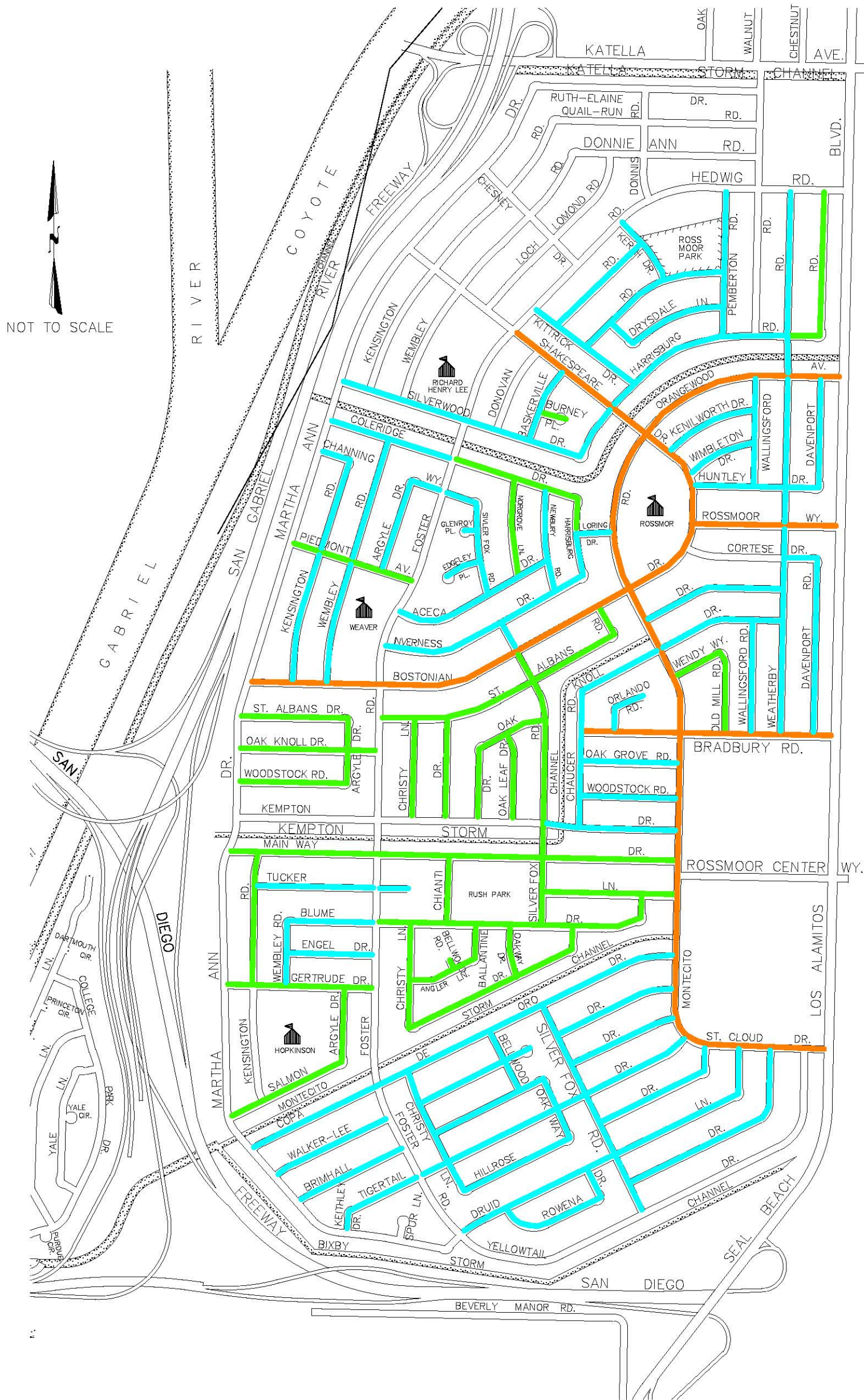
LOCATIONS OF STOP SIGNS THAT ARE OBSCURED BY TREE FOLIAGE

The following locations were identified by California Highway Patrol (CHP) Officer Matt Musselman and RCSD staff as intersections where tree foliage is obscuring the stop signs:

- 1. Northbound Martha Ann Drive @ Mainway Drive*
- 2. Southbound Foster Road @ Bostonian Drive*
- 3. Southbound Foster Road @ Mainway Drive*
- 4. Northbound Foster Road @ Mainway Drive*
- 5. Westbound Tigertail Drive @ Foster Road*
- 6. Southbound Montecito Road @ Bradbury Road*
- 7. Eastbound Shakespeare Drive @ Foster Road*

RCSD staff is working closely with the CHP to determine if the trees at these locations can be trimmed, or if they need to be removed.
