

The District will be redesigning its website's homepage to include a transparency module. This area will consolidate popular documents and streamline access to agendas, minutes, budgets, and public records. It has come to our attention that many people mistakenly believe that Rossmoor Community Services District employees receive pensions. RCSD employees do not receive pensions or retirement benefits of any kind. Salaries fall within the low median range. ### **TREE-LICIOUS**



Nothing beats the taste and smell of real maple syrup poured over pancakes, waffles or warm cereal. Maple syrup is made by tapping the trunks of certain types of maple trees and collecting the xylem sap. The sap is then boiled down to obtain pure syrup without chemical agents or preservatives. The sugar maple tree is the most commonly used source, however other species of maple trees, such as the red or black maple, are also used because of their high sugar content. Maple trees are usually tapped beginning at

30 to 40 years of age and sap can continue being harvested until the trees are over 100 years old. Most tapping is done in the spring, and occasionally in the fall; if conditions are right. Contrary to popular belief, the tapping process does not harm the tree. Vermont is the largest producer of maple syrup in the United States. The syrup is graded according to its density or translucency. Maple syrup is used in baking, as a sweetening or flavoring agent and can be made into a wide variety of confections. It takes many gal-

lons of sap to produce just one gallon of real maple syrup. All sugars are not created equal; maple syrup is considered a healthy alternative. Beware of imitations that are basically flavored corn syrup, many of which contain harmful chemicals and preservatives. There is no substitute for pure maple syrup which can be found at most supermarkets, and local farmers markets.

They have organized a new project that will fix the

broken tiles, add new tiles and donate any additional funds raised to the District for the purpose of making Rush Park's existing Tot Lot ADA compliant.
