#### **ILLEGAL REMOVAL OF PARKWAY TREES**

Parkway and median trees are valuable community assets. Parkway and median trees are public, not private property. A parkway, as described in District Policy No. 3080, is the County of Orange (County) owned area between the sidewalk and curb. The median is the County owned area dividing Rossmoor Way. Every reasonable effort will be made to preserve this natural resource in order to retain and improve this local scenic and environmental asset. Homeowners, residents or their agents shall not plant, trim or remove parkway and median trees.

The Rossmoor Community Services District (District) has the authority and responsibility to plant and trim trees either directly or through the County or other third parties. The District recommends removals to the County and the County has the authority to remove trees. The County of Orange is responsible for the preventative or remedial tree root pruning to aid in the control of sidewalk, curb and gutter damage. The District will coordinate with the County to perform this work and any other alternatives to tree removal. Request for inspections, planting, trimming or removal shall be made with the District office. It is also important to know that it is illegal for residents to prune or remove the parkways trees in Rossmoor. Please help the District to maintain this policy by informing new neighbors of it and reporting any violations to RSCD. Residents that feel their tree needs pruning or care can contact the <a href="Tree Program Assistant, Mary Kingman">Tree Program Assistant, Mary Kingman</a>, for an evaluation.—MK


