REVIEW OF FY 2024-2025 COMPLETED CAPITAL PROJECTS

#### RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the CIP Committee review the attached overview of the capital expenditures for FY 2024-2025.

#### INFORMATION

The total for FY 2024/2025 capital improvement projects is an estimated \$202,680. These projects include the following:

#### Rossmoor Park

- Resurfaced basketball, pickleball and tennis courts \$65,961 (General Fund)
- 2. A project still in process under the approved grant is the canopy and cement pad at Rossmoor Park. Architectural Drawings and Engineering Documents are completed and have been submitted to the County of Orange for review and approval (see attached). The purchase and manufacturing of materials will begin upon approval of the plans. The request for proposals for installation of the Canopy project will be publicized as soon as the equipment is ordered. Installation is anticipated to be mid-Spring. The Rossmoor Community Services District (RCSD) currently has a grant balance of \$64,623 that is ear-marked for the Rossmoor Park shade canopy. Since the budget for 2024-2025 is \$75,000 for the shade canopy project, reimbursement from the grant would be \$60,000. There will be a surplus of \$4,623 to offset any change orders that may occur. Other amenities will include four park benches, BBQs and two trash cans.

1. Auditorium Flooring - \$61,719 (received Prop 68 Grant reimbursement of \$39,824)







# **BUDGET PREPARATION, ADOPTION AND REVISION**

- **3020.10** <u>Budget Calendar:</u> This policy shall serve as the budget calendar unless the Board modifies the dates herein. If so, the General Manager shall prepare and the Board shall adopt a budget calendar for the succeeding fiscal year at the March meeting of the Board.
- **3020.20** Preliminary Budget: A Preliminary Budget based on current year estimates to close and on forecasting of expected revenues and expenditures for the succeeding fiscal year shall be prepared by the General Manager by April 30. The Preliminary Budget shall conform to generally accepted accounting and budgeting procedures for special districts.
  - **3020.21** <u>RCSD Five-Year Fiscal Plan:</u> Concurrently with the preparation of the Preliminary Budget, the General Manager shall update the Plan for review by the Budget Committee.
- **3020.25** Public Works/CIP Committee: The Public Works/Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) Committee is comprised of two Board members and the General Manager. The President of the Board appoints the members of the Committee
  - **3025.26** Capitol Project Budget: Prior to the development of the Preliminary Budget, the Public Works/CIP Committee shall meet and make recommendations to the Board on recommended capital improvement projects for inclusion in the proposed Fund 40 budget portion of the Preliminary Budget. Capital improvement projects shall be those projects with an estimated cost of \$5,000 or over and have a five-year service life. Projects of a lesser amount or of less than a five-year service life will be included in the appropriate departmental budgets of Fund 10 of the Preliminary Budget.
- 3020.30 <u>Budget Committee:</u> The Budget Committee is comprised of two Board members and the General Manager. The President of the Board appoints members to the Committee.
  - **3020.31** Presentation of Preliminary Budget: The Budget Committee shall review the Preliminary Budget prepared by the General Manager and make recommended changes. The General Manager shall present the amended Preliminary Budget to the Board at its meeting in May.
- 3020.40 <u>Preliminary Budget:</u> The proposed Preliminary Budget, as reviewed and amended by the Budget Committee, shall be reviewed and approved by the Board at its May meeting.
- 3020.50 <u>Appropriations Limit:</u> On or before July 1 of each year, the Board shall adopt a resolution establishing its appropriations limit pursuant to Section 61113 of the Government Code.
- **3020.60** Public Hearing Notice: On or before July 1 of each year, and at least two weeks before the hearing, a notice of public hearing shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation, which specifies the following:
  - **3020.61** Availability for Inspection: The proposed Final Budget shall be available for inspection at a specified time in the District office.

**3020.62** Public Hearing: The date, time and place of the meeting of the Board when the Board will meet to adopt the Final Budget and that any person may appear and be heard regarding any item in the budget or the addition of other items.

**3020.70** Second Public Notice: The public notice must be published a second time at least two (2) weeks before the Final Budget hearing in at least one newspaper of general circulation in accordance with Section 61110(d) of the Government Code.

**3020.80** Final Budget Adoption: The General Manager shall submit a Final Budget to the Board as soon as practicable, but no later than the meeting of the Board in August. The Final Budget shall be based on the latest financial data available or the audited numbers for the previous fiscal year, if available. At the August Board meeting or sooner, the Board will hold the public hearing on the Final Budget and upon completion of the public hearing will consider adoption of the Final Budget. On or before September 1 of each year, the Board must adopt a Final Budget that conforms to generally accepted accounting and budgeting procedures for special districts. Immediately thereafter, the Board shall adopt a Resolution stating the District Annual Budget Revenues and Expenses Totals by Fund.

**3020.90** County Auditor: After Final Budget adoption and completion of the District's Financial Audit, the General Manager shall forward a copy of both documents to the County Auditor.

3020.100 <u>Budget Adjustment:</u> The Budget Committee shall review budget adjustments prepared by the General Manager prior to the February Board meeting. The General Manager shall present budget adjustment recommendations at the February meeting of the Board. The Board shall review current revenue and expenditure projections and make necessary adjustments to the current Budget, which are reflective of the District's current financial condition. The Board shall adjust the budget, if necessary, by adoption of a resolution amending the budget.

**3020.110** <u>Budgetary Control</u>: Control of movement of funds is governed by Policy No. 3021 Budgetary Control.

#### **BUDGETARY CONTROL**

- **3021.10** <u>Budgetary Control:</u> This policy shall serve as the budget control document for the District and shall govern the movement of funds within the budget.
- **3021.20** <u>Budget Elements</u>: The District's expense budget is structured upon Funds, Departments and Departmental account classes which currently include Salaries and Benefits, Operations and Maintenance, Contract Services and Capital Expenditures. Each of these elements contains enumerated line items of expense.
- 3021.30 Budget Control Points: Movement or transfer of funds is controlled as follows:
  - **3021.31** Movement or Transfer of Budgeted Amounts Between Funds or Between Departments: Board approval by Resolution is required for this transaction.
  - 3021.32 <u>Transfer of Budgeted Amounts Between and Among Line Items Within a Department:</u> The General Manager has the authority, in accordance with Policy No. 2000.80, to expend funds in accordance with the latest approved Budget. Line Item Transfers within a Department budget shall not exceed \$5,000 without Board approval.
- **3021.40** <u>Budget Preparation, Adoption ad Revision:</u> Budget preparation, adoption, and revision are governed by Policy No. 3020 Budget Preparation, Adoption and Revision.
- **3021.50** Expenditure/Purchasing Limits: Expenditure/purchasing limits (\$5,000) and control are governed by Policy No. 3050 District Expenditure, Purchasing, Bidding and Contracting Limits.

Please note that the items listed above are dependent on available funding. District staff is looking into the possibility of grant availability.



# Q1 Are you a Rossmoor resident?



# Q2 What brings you to the Rossmoor parks or facilities? (check all that apply)








# Q4 How would you rate the quality and maintenance of our rental facilities?








# Q5 How satisfied or are you with community events and programming?



# Q6 How satisfied are you with the street sweeping service?



# Q7 How satisfied are you with the trash pick up service?



# Q8 How satisfied are you with community safety?



**Assessment:** Given that RCSD is in a highly affluent, primarily white area, funding opportunities are highly limited. If Rossmoor is willing to offer programs and services to low-income residents, BIPOC community members, veterans, individuals with disabilities, etc. (marginalized populations) that would put them in a better position to receive funding whether that be from private foundations or government grants. Right now, Rossmoor would have to partner with the county on projects to be competitive for

grants. Low cost loans are another option for funding for RCSD, such as ISRF for facilities rehab or SRF for plumbing.

### California Department of Parks and Recreation: Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF)

Deadline: June 2025 **Amount:** Up to \$6 million

Match: Yes - 50%

Eligibility: Cities, counties, tribal governments, JPAs, park districts, and special districts with authority

to acquire, operate and maintain public park and recreation areas

Project must be acquisition or development, combination projects are not eligible. Development of recreation features must be for outdoor recreation, not indoor recreation. See the list of recreation features in the application guide.

Although this can fund a playground, this is not recommended for Rossmoor CSD to apply alone. If RCSD does apply it should be to increase park space and access, in collaboration with the County of Orange.

#### CalRecycle: Rubberized Pavement Grant Program

Deadline: September 2025

Amount: The maximum grant award is \$250,000 for individual applications, \$350,000 for joint applications, and \$500,000 for Qualifying Tribal Entities

Match: No, funds based on amount of rubberized pavement needed (weight)

Eligibility: Local governments (cities, counties, or cities and counties) as defined in PRC section 48617. Other local governmental agencies (including regional park districts, special districts, and Joint Powers Authorities (JPA) [where all participating entities are otherwise eligible]). Qualifying Tribal Entities (see Proposed Changes). State Agencies (only for Class 1 bikeways, greenways, and disability access projects at parks).

Purpose: The Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) administers a program to provide opportunities to divert waste tires from landfill disposal, prevent illegal tire dumping, and promote markets for recycled-content tire products. The Rubberized Pavement Grant Program is designed to promote markets for recycled-content surfacing products derived from only Californiagenerated waste tires. It is aimed at encouraging first-time or limited users of rubberized pavement in two project types - Rubberized Asphalt Concrete Hot-Mix (Hot-Mix) and Rubberized Chip Seal (Chip Seal).

- A parking lot will not be as competitive as a road connected to a parking lot. This grant is focused on paving roads and streets primarily. However this could be applied to for paving a parking lot.

#### Infrastructure State Revolving Fund (ISRF) Program

Administered by: California Infrastructure and Economic Development Bank (IBank)

Funding Details: Loans range from \$1 million to \$65 million with terms up to 30 years.

Eligibility: Cities, counties, special districts, and nonprofit organizations sponsored by public agencies. Application Process: Applications are accepted continuously on a first-come, first-served basis.

Purpose: Provides low-cost, direct loans to local governments and nonprofits for a wide variety of public infrastructure projects, including parking and community facilities.

**Eligibility:** Local governments, including cities, townships, counties, special district governments, state agencies and federally recognized tribal governments (who choose to apply as sub applicants) are considered sub applicants. They must submit sub applications to their state, territory, or tribal applicant agency.

• Sub applicants must have a FEMA-approved local or tribal Hazard Mitigation Plan in accordance with Title 44 Code of Federal Regulations Part 201 by the application deadline. They must also have one at the time of obligation of grant funds for hazard mitigation projects and capability-and capacity-building activities. Hazard mitigation planning and planning-related activities, partnerships and building codes are exempt from the plan requirement. Federally recognized tribal governments, submitting as sub applicants to a state or territory, are included in this exemption.

#### KaBOOM!: Build it with KaBOOM!

Deadline: Continuous

Amount: \$15,000 - Grantees are awarded a \$15,000 grant to be used toward the purchase of playground equipment. To supplement the \$15,000 KaBOOM! grant, grantees are required to raise a minimum of \$9,000 (for a total project value of \$24,000) up to a maximum of \$35,000 (for a total project value of \$50,000) towards the cost of the playground project. This amount does not include the cost for safety surfacing, freight, site preparation, installation supervision and any other non-playground equipment items.

Match: \$9,000

Eligibility: Must be located in San Jose, Los Angeles County, San Francisco, Brisbane, San Bernardino, Anaheim, Oakland or Santa Ana (See other qualified Community Partner requirements) <a href="https://kaboom.org/grants/build\_it\_with\_kaboom#eligibility">https://kaboom.org/grants/build\_it\_with\_kaboom#eligibility</a>

A Build it with KaBOOM! grant provides the facilitation and support of an experienced Project Manager as community members embark on a 5–12 week planning process. After selection, all partners will join together for a community Design Day, inviting play experts (the kids, of course) to design their dream playspace.

Orange County is an eligible partner community, but funding is currently not open for the Orange County location. Check back for future funding in Orange County

 This would also have to cater towards kids with disabilities or marginalized communities, providing a play space for those who need it the most.
