
THANK YOU NOTES...



REPAIRS AND RENOVATIONS

• Rush Park Tot Lot: Renovations began early December 2013 and were completed December 30, 2013. Demolition crews removed old playground equipment from Rush Park and replaced it with new playground equipment which is both ADA and playground safety compliant. The new play surface is 50/50-Sand/Pour-in-Place. The excess sand was removed and relocated to Rossmoor Park. The new struc-

WINTER TREE TIPS

Even with winter upon us, the mild climate of Southern California allows us to still enjoy the beautiful fall colors on many of our trees. The Liquidambars of Rossmoor are still showing off their brilliant reds and golds and the Chinese Pistaches are full of bright color and red berries. Many of the deciduous trees are already losing their leaves, littering streets and parkways and putting rakes and blowers to work. Although most people chose to dispose of the leaf litter in the trash, an Earth-friendly alternative to consider is mixing the leaves into a compost pile or bin with green kitchen waste. Even just a leaf pile in a back corner or side yard will break down fairly quickly with regular turning over and provides a great mulch for your garden.

With the holidays come the festive hanging of outdoor lights and decorations. Please remember that it is against RCSD policy to nail or staple anything to the parkway trees since puncturing the bark of a tree can have an affect on its health. Also, wrapping foil around trees can cause moisture to become trapped against the trunk, leading to rot or fungal diseases.



We also want to remind residents that it is illegal for to prune or remove the parkways trees in Rossmoor. Please help the District to maintain this policy by informing new neighbors of it and reporting any violations to RSCD. Residents that feel a parkway tree needs pruning or care can contact RCSD Tree Consultant, Mary Kingman, for an evaluation. With the community's help, our beautiful urban forest can continue to thrive and insure Rossmoor's status as a Tree City U.S.A.
